2018 (UCR) Type 1- Uniform Crime Report Statistics

Madison Police Department staff personnel have finalized data entry for the year 2018. The attached report is what is commonly referred to as the "UCR" crime report. This is the report, which is voluntarily furnished to the (FBI) Federal Bureau of Investigations on a national basis concerning what is classified as the major crime categories or "Type 1" crimes which have been reported to the Madison Police Department during the 2018 year. The Police Department considers this report an important measuring tool, which we use to gauge manpower and equipment resource deployment, crime prevention techniques and methods, and crime detection/suppression tactics.

The Madison Police Department continues to utilize a combination of citizen input and programs, along with a highly visible police presence in an attempt to keep crime to a minimum. Citizen participation is a major component to any success of anti-crime efforts in the City of Madison. As in years past, year 2018 has seen a continuation of the population growth in the City and a tremendous and steady growth in the commercial, retail and professional community.

During 2018, the figures will indicate an overall total of 332 type 1 crimes reported. This is an increase of 10 from 2017 figures. Larcenies, to include shoplifting, continue to be the leading category. We remind our citizens to close carports when not in use, remove valuables from their vehicles and secure them at all times. Domestic violence assault (in the assault category) had the largest increase for the year.

I congratulate the City of Madison officials, members of the Madison Police Department and especially the citizens of the City for a partnership that is successfully working to keep crime to a minimum and the City a safe and wholesome environment to live, raise a family and retire.
