# MINUTES OF THE FIRST REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF MADISON, MISSISSIPPI

## January 2, 2019

### STATE OF MISSISSIPPI COUNTY OF MADISON

### INTRODUCTION AND ATTENDANCE

The first regular monthly meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Madison, Mississippi was held on Wednesday, January 2, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. in the Municipal Courtroom at the Madison Justice Complex. Those present were Mayor Mary Hawkins Butler, Aldermen Patricia Peeler, Ken Jacobs, Steve Hickok, Mike Hudgins, and Guy Bowering, City Attorney Dale Danks, City Clerk/Director of Finance and Administration Susan Crandall and Chief Deputy City Clerk Lisa Winstead. Alderman Tawanna Tatum and Warren Strain were absent.

Mayor Hawkins Butler called the meeting to order. After a prayer led by Alderman Jacobs and the Pledge of Allegiance led by Alderman Peeler, the meeting proceeded as follows:

## BILL HULSEY- SANDALWOOD SUBDIVISION STREETS

Mr. Bill Hulsey, a resident of Sandalwood, addressed the Mayor and Board regarding concerns he has about the condition of streets in Sandalwood and the contractor doing the repairs and resurfacing. His comments were appreciated and taken under advisement.

## HOY ROAD PROJECT - CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST OF LATTER DAY SAINTS ROW

With regard to the acquisition of Hoy Road right-of-way property owned by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, City Attorney Danks explained that the court appraisal for the property is \$4,000.00 and that the City needs to deposit a minimum of 85%, or \$3,400.00 of this amount. Alderman Hudgins made the motion to authorize the City Clerk to deposits these funds in the amount of \$3,400.00 as ordered. Alderman Jacobs seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by all Alderman present. Mayor Hawkins Butler declared the motion carried. With no further business for discussion, the motion was duly made by Alderman Hickok seconded by Alderman Bowering and unanimously carried to adjourn the meeting. Mayor Hawkins Butler declared the meeting adjourned.
