# MINUTES OF THE FIRST REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF MADISON, MISSISSIPPI

### December 4, 2018

## STATE OF MISSISSIPPI COUNTY OF MADISON

#### INTRODUCTION AND ATTENDANCE

The first regular monthly meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Madison, Mississippi was held on Tuesday, December 4, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. in the Municipal Courtroom at the Madison Justice Complex. Those present were Mayor Mary Hawkins Butler, Aldermen Tawanna Tatum, Patricia Peeler, Ken Jacobs, Mike Hudgins, Guy Bowering, and Warren Strain, City Attorney Dale Danks, City Clerk/Director of Finance and Administration Susan Crandall and Chief Deputy City Clerk Lisa Winstead. Alderman Steve Hickok was absent.

Mayor Hawkins Butler called the meeting to order. She welcomed members of the St. Matthews' Boy Scout Troop 15 and their troop leader, Judge Keith Ball to the meeting. Members of this troop attend the meeting in partial fulfillment of requirements to earn their Citizenship in the Community Badge. After the prayer led by Alderman Ken Jacobs and the Pledge of Allegiance led by Boy Scout Skyler Gentry, the meeting proceeded as follows:

# APPEAL OF HOME OCCUPATON PERMIT, JONATHAN STILL, J&S OUTDOORS, LLC, 100 FONTANELLE DRIVE - Continued

Due to the absence of the applicant, Mayor Hawkins Butler asked for a motion to continue the discussion of appeal at the next regular scheduled Board meeting to be held on Tuesday, December 18, 2018. # WISE CARTER, ATTORNEYS - REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION OF PRIOR APPROVED SPECIAL EXCEPTON OF PROPERTY ON BOZEMAN ROAD - Approved

Community Development Director Kianca Stringfellow presented the request of Wise Carter, attorneys for Trend Consultants concerning the special exception for a quasi-public use in a R-1 Residential District for the purpose of constructing a skilled nursing facility. The request was originally approved in 2016, reconsidered and extended for a one-year period in March 2018 and will expire soon. The applicant is requesting an additional extension for a one-year period. After brief discussion, Alderman Jacobs made the motion to approve another one-year extension. Alderman Peeler seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous in favor of approval. Mayor Hawkins Butler declared the motion carried. # DISCUSSION REGARDING ADOPTION OF 2018 INTERNATIONAL PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE - Approved

City Attorney Dale Long presented a Resolution Adopting an Ordinance Adopting the International Property Maintenance Code (2018 Edition). He stated that the City is currently operating under the 2012 Edition and explained some changes relevant to the City of Madison which have been made in the proposed Ordinance for the 2018 Edition. After brief discussion, the motion was made by Alderman Bowering to adopt the Resolution as presented. Alderman Tatum seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous in favor of approval. Mayor Hawkins Butler declared the motion carried. This Resolution and Ordinance is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit L.

With no further business for discussion, Mayor Hawkins Butler asked for a motion to declare the Board meeting adjourned.
